Arunkumar completed his Bachelors in Fine Arts (Sculpture) between 1989-1993 & Masters in Fine Arts (Sculpture) between 1994-1995 both from the Faculty of Fine Arts, M S University, Baroda.

His use of readymade objects such as toys, plastic, ceramics, cow dung, hay & TV monitors, paper pulp, white cement, repurposed wood give us a glimpse of his susceptibility towards the neo-pop movement. His toy-like, yet intricate sculptural works often convey a simple message.

F N SOUZA

(1924 - 2002)

Souza was one of the first painters to achieve international recognition from a newly independent India, as well as a leading figure of its avant-garde movement. His style was heavily inspired from Expressionism often being called as the "Indian Picasso". Souza was known for his aggressive lines and thick application of color. He was fascinated with images of the sacred and the profane, among his favorite subjects were the human figure engaged in erotic acts and organized rituals of religion. He was one of the founding members of the Progressive Artists' Group, (then Bombay).

JAYASRI BURMAN

Born in 1960, Calcutta, West Bengal.

She completed her studies at Kala Bhavan in Santiniketan and at the Government College of Art and Craft, Kolkata where she completed a Master of Arts in Painting. She also went to Paris to study printmaking under Monsieur Ceizerzi.

An exponent of the mythical, miniature and the modern, in her universe of art fables. The essence of her paintings derives their vibrance from the myriad rituals and festivals and their alluring impressions. It has shaped her experiences and the roots she has flown out from. They serve as the pillars of her verity and integrity.

She was invited at the President's House as an Artist-in residence and has won prestigious awards such as ICON of Indian Art by Verve Magazine and Devi awards.

K G SUBRAMANYAN

(1924 - 2016)

Subramanyan studied art under the tutelage of pioneers of Indian modern art such as Nandalal Bose, Benode Behari Mukherjee & Ramkinkar Baij at the Visva Bharati University, Kala Bhavan in Santiniketan. He later became a lecturer at the Faculty of Fine Arts, in M. S. University in Baroda having taken a brief break to study at the Slade School of Art as a British Council Scholar, London. He also returned to Santiniketan to teach as a professor in painting until his retirement in 1989 and the same year he was also made Professor Emeritus of Visva Bharati.

He was greatly influenced by the folk arts and crafts from Kerala, Kalighat painting & Pattachitra from Bengal and Odisha as well as from the Indian court paintings. In a career spanning nearly seven decades, K G Subramanyan's works have been exhibited in over fifty solo shows, including an extensive 2015-2016 exhibition by the Seagull Foundation for the Arts in collaboration with the Jehangir Art Gallery- Mumbai, and the Harrington Street Arts Centre- Kolkata. He has received honors and awards such as the Medallion of Honorable Mention, Biennale in Brazil, the Kalidas Samman, National Award by the Lalit Kala Academy, Abanindra Puraskar and the Lifetime Achievement Award by the Academy of Fine Arts. He has also been awarded the exceptionally prestigious Padma Shri, Padma Bhushan and the Padma Vibhushan from the Government of India for his contribution to Indian art.

LAXMA GOUD

Born in 1940, Nizampur, Hyderabad.

Laxma studied drawing and painting at the Government college of Fine Arts & Architecture, Hyderabad and studied Mural painting under K. G. Subramanyan at the Faculty of Fine Arts, M. s. University, Baroda from 1963 to 1965. He is well-known for his pen and ink drawings and etchings of interesting combination of village nostalgia, the surreal and the erotic.
