Visual Echoes, an online exhibition of print-makers brings forth reflections of the artistic process from ideation to image which echoes the transformation from mind to actual visual forms. All the artists represented here with their artistic idioms continue to engage in socio-cultural and ecological aspects within their realm.

Each artists' employ different techniques of printmaking practice and their works with the elements of graphic representation of their visual thoughts which echo in their minds and eventually take the shape of artwork. As artists they often engage in subjects that shape their ideas, observations and concerns from their environment and experiences.

Laxma Goud's draws source from his childhood memories of growing up in rural and tribal environs that often bring forth the elements of nature, man and woman relationships, animals and so forth and sometimes highlighting the aspects of sexuality and fertility. For Kavita Nayar, it is her constant and spontaneous engagement with the natural surroundings that brings out semi-abstract forms of trees, seeds and also the human emotions in her works. The Seeds of Love is all about Motherhood, its core nature of life through conception, nurturing and growth becomes part of the creative process.

Kavita Shah works primarily on the ecological issues we face today which are against the natural environment. She uses the elements from nature such as flora and fauna, man-made objects and juxtaposes them against one another that reflect the conflicts of ecological imbalance.

In Bhaskar Vadla's work, the transitions in urban landscape are due to constant struggle between ecology and modernization signified by prevalent machines overpowering man-power. The heavy backhoes and earth excavators in the urban construction appear as 'extra-terrestrial bodies' or even as unearthed prehistoric fossils become as metaphorical conjunctions of both past and present social setup.

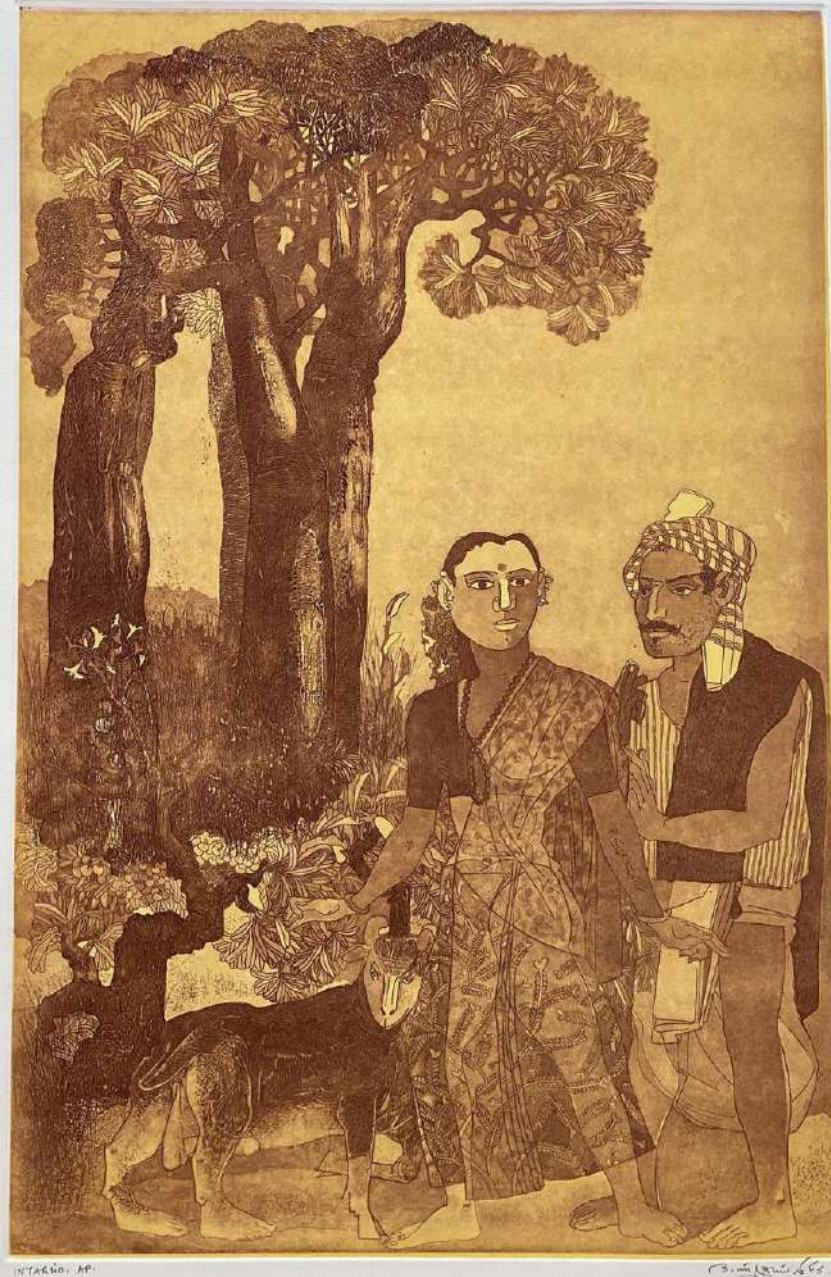
For Sonal Varshneya, in her Ready to red carpet series, the toe-ringed feet epitomize the status of being a married woman and symbolizes socio-cultural ideas of femininity, beauty, prosperity and health benefits to manage menstrual pain.

K Laxma Goud

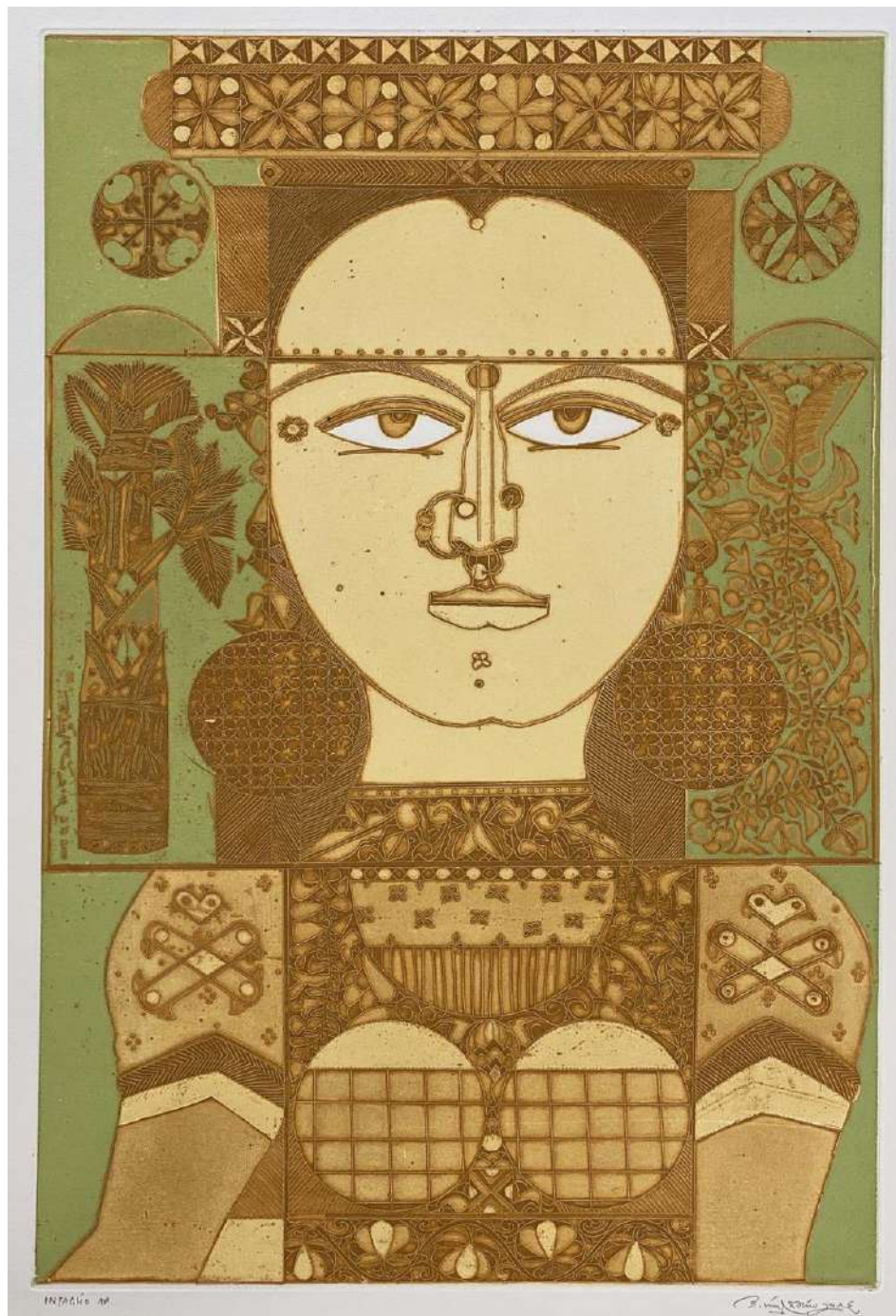
K Laxma Goud, born 1940, is a painter, printmaker. He has worked in various mediums such as mural, reverse glass painting, sculpture and other paint & print media.

After his basic art education at Government Art and Architecture, he went on to study Mural painting and Printmaking at Faculty of Fine Arts, M.S.University of Baroda from 1963 to 1965 under the tutelage of K G Subramanyan, N S Bendre and others. He is known for his immaculate printmaking techniques, murals and sculptures made of terracotta and bronzes, reverse glass painting and much more. His oeuvre as an artist has been diverse from being a textile designer, designing of craft objects and as a teacher he was instrumental in setting up the Department of Fine Arts at S.N School, University of Hyderabad.

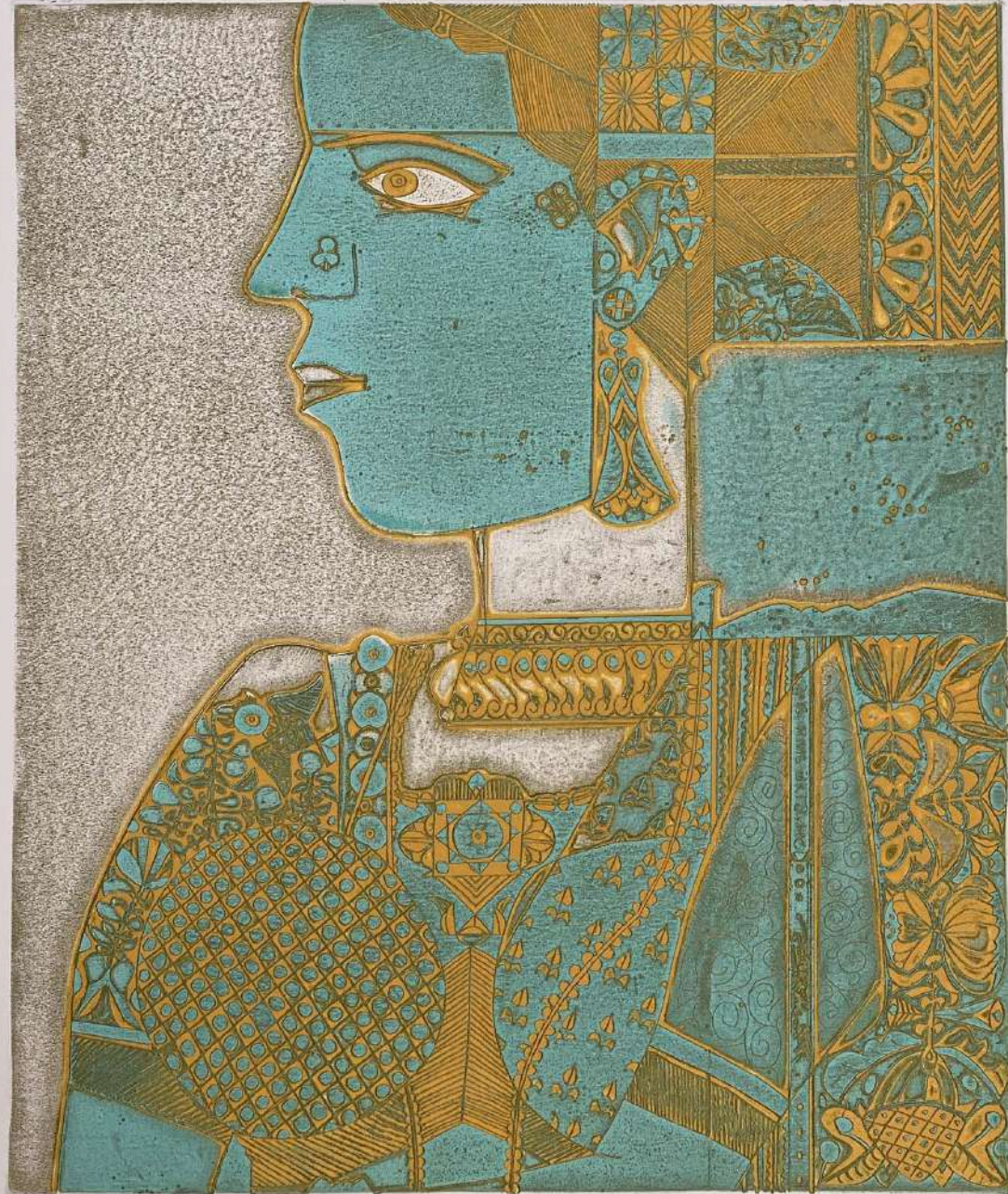

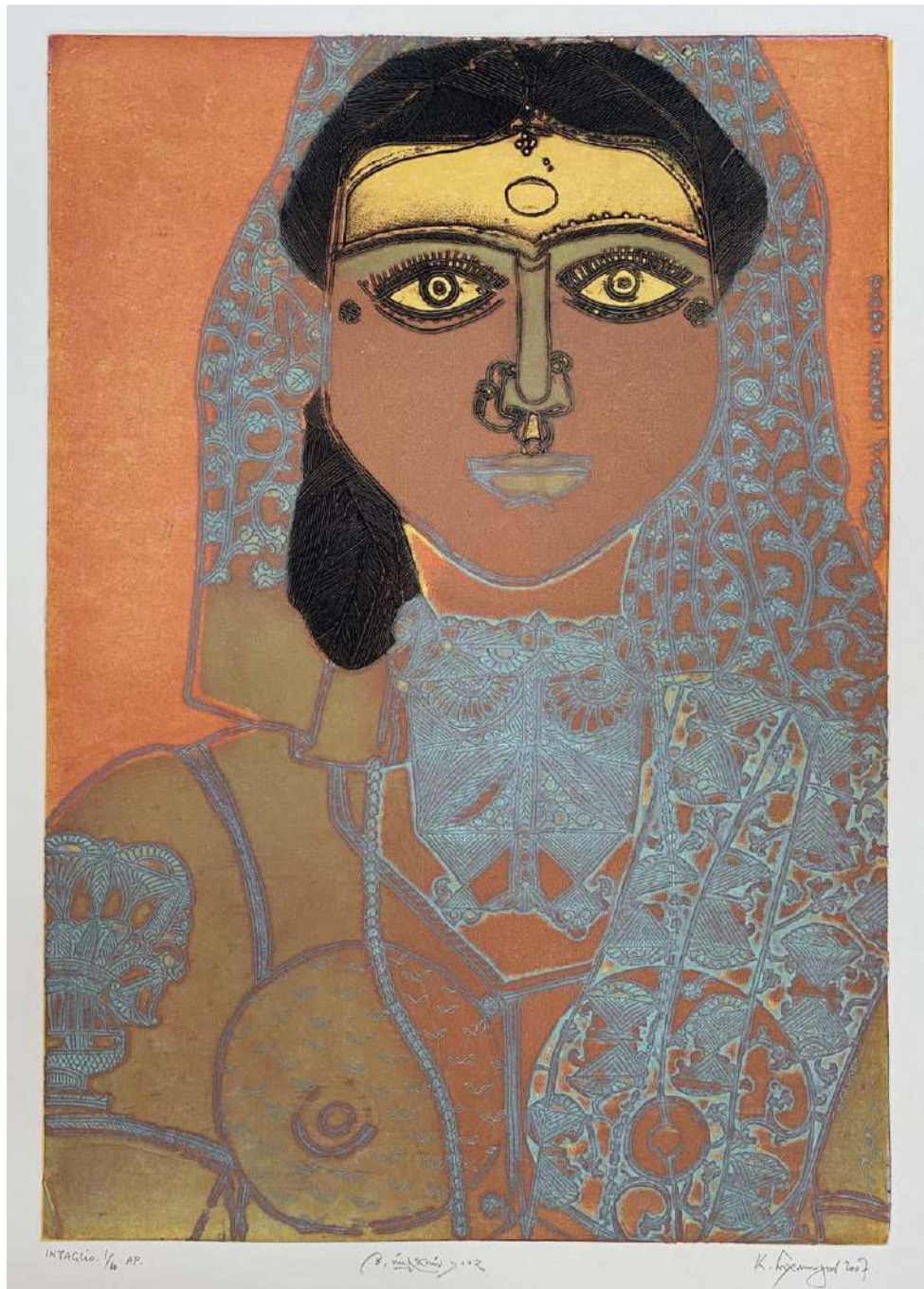
K. Laxma Goud

Kavita Nayar

Kavita Nayar, born 1957, received her undergraduate degree from Kala Bhavan, Santiniketan and post-graduation from College of Art, New Delhi. A scholarship from the government led her to Cite International Des Arts & Ecole des Beaux to work for further practice and to hone her printmaking skills in 1985-86 and later in 1990 with Creative Fund Fellowship she went to Luxembourg to learn Serigraphy under a master.

Apart from her proficiency in printmaking, Kavita works with ease in other mediums such as painting, glass and more. In academics she has been part of several art and design institutions in the capacity of visiting faculty in Delhi and other cities.

She has been part of several national and international exhibitions, Triennale and printmaking workshops both in India and abroad. Her works are part of both private and museum collections in India and foreign countries. She is the founder trustee of Kala Sakshi Memorial Trust which provides scholarships and mentoring programmes for young art students.

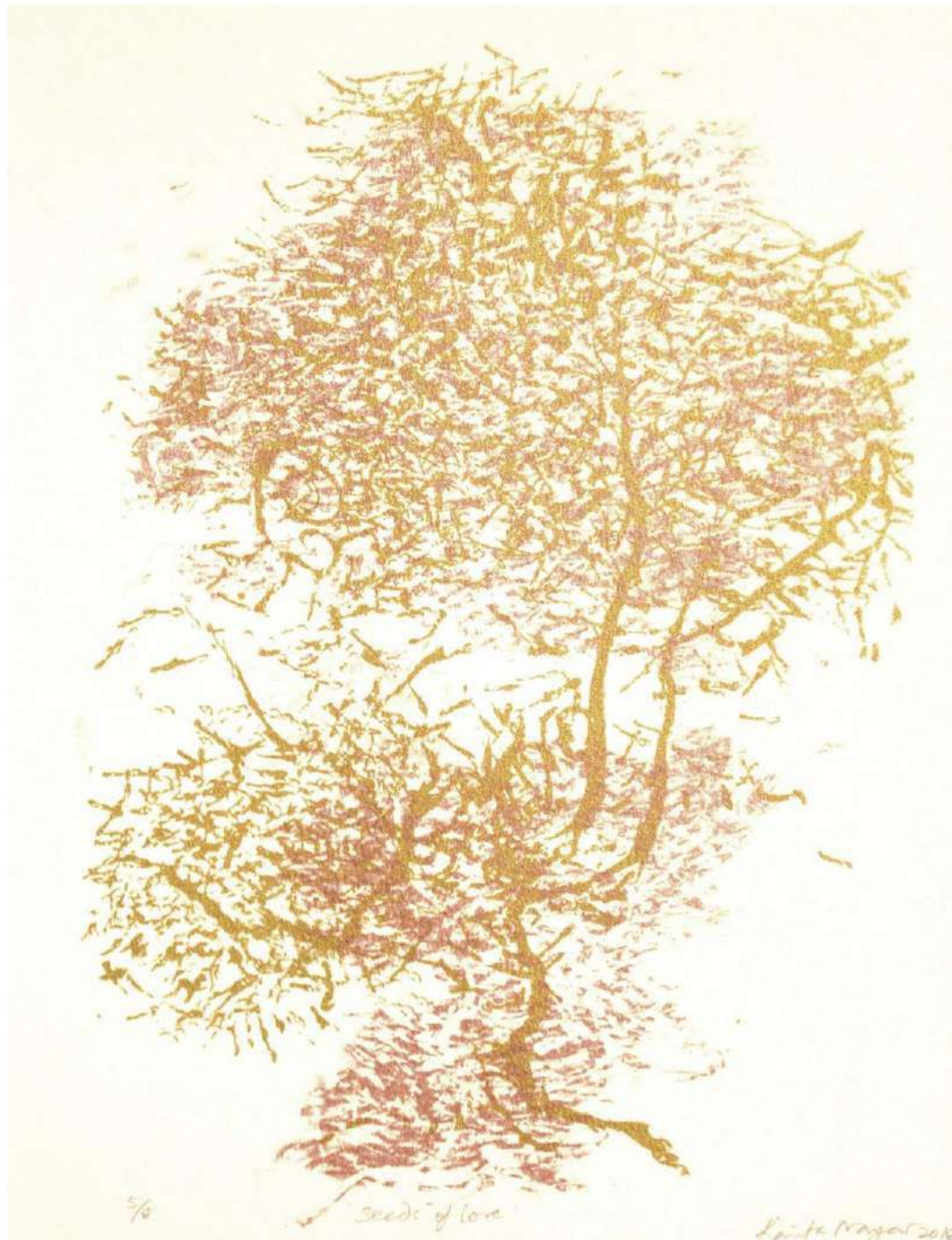

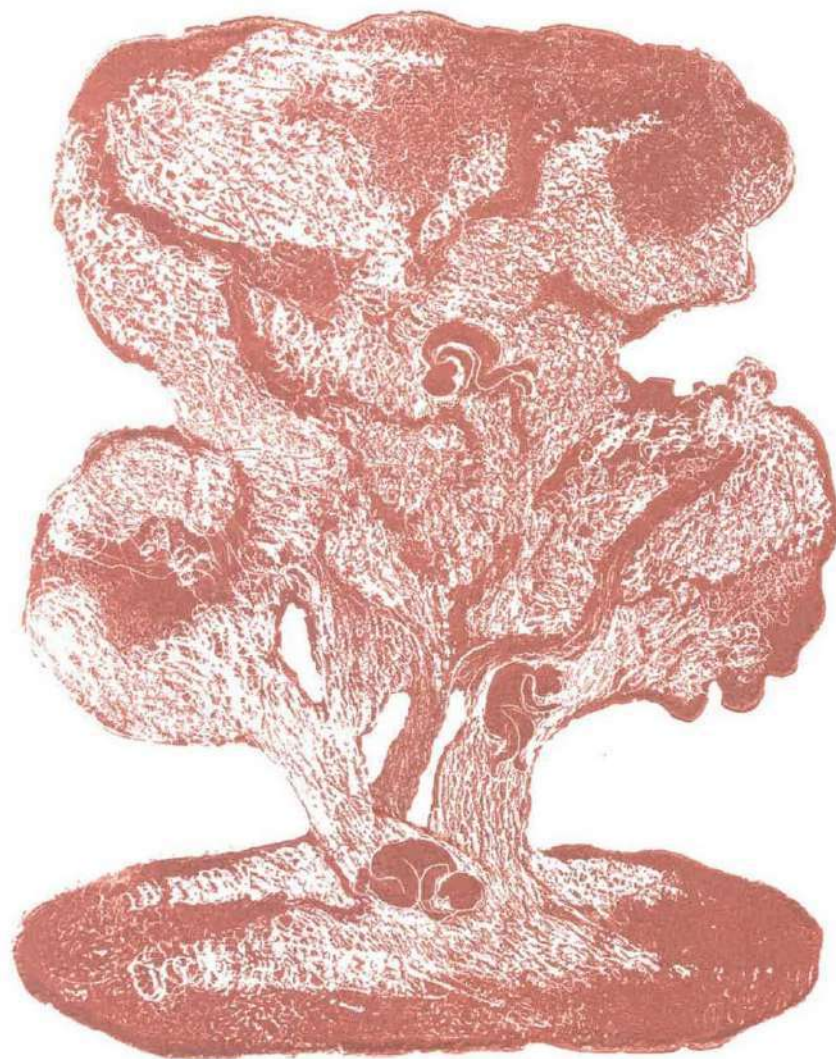

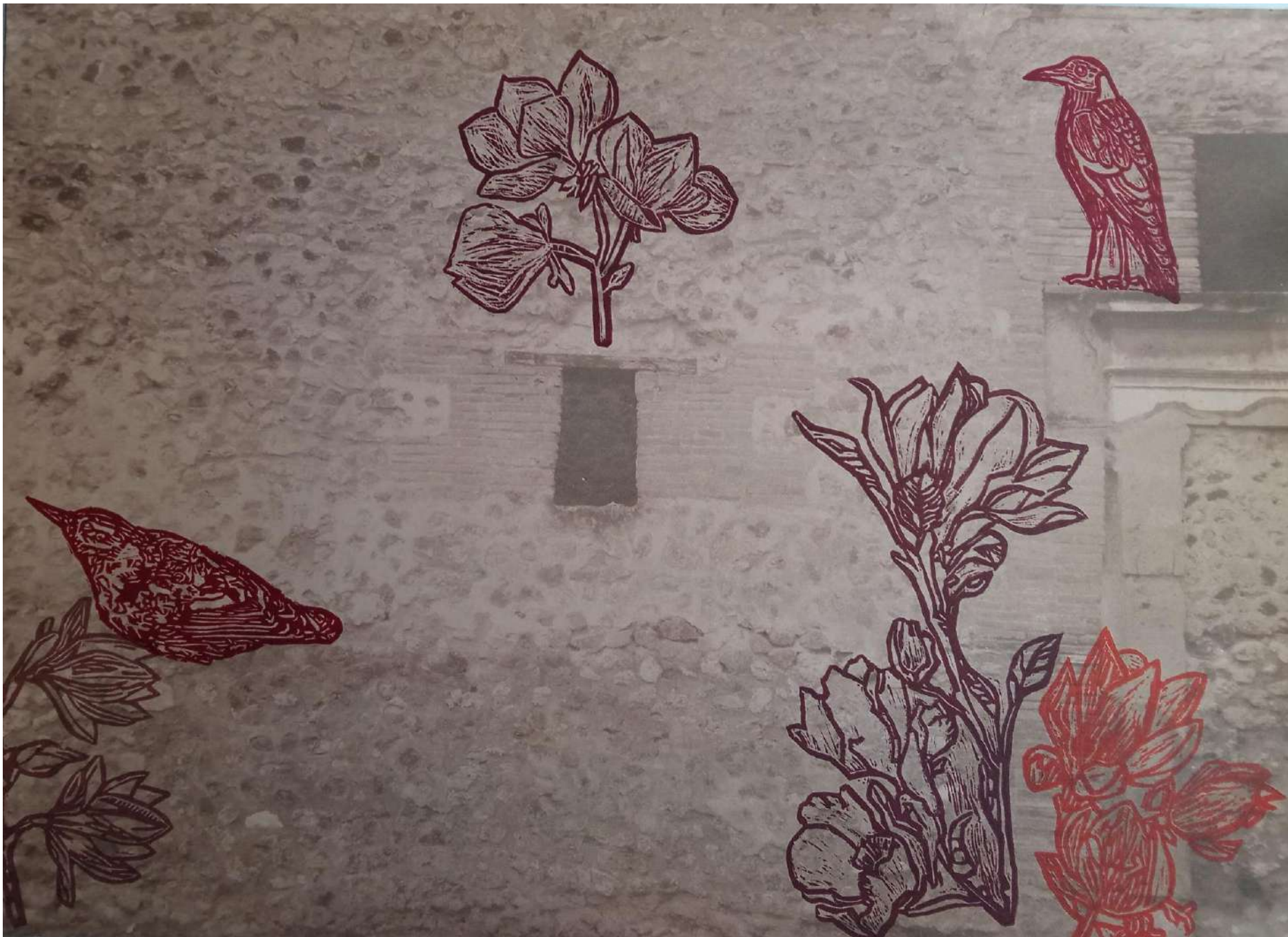
Kavita Shah

As a visual artist and educationist with several art, design and architectural institutions, she has ensured to take art to every strata of the society. She is the co-founder of Chhaap Foundation for Printmaking Trust and a board member of Res Artis.

She has been part of both national and international exhibitions, Triennial and Bharat Bhavan Print Biennial and several significant Print exchange programmes. She has compiled international print portfolios called Footprints, Ganjifa, Snakes & Ladders and Chess and some of them have been widely exhibited in India and abroad and many of her works her part of important collections in India and abroad.

Kavita was artist-in residence in Finland and Italy, worked in Atelier in Paris and was part of Printmakers Workshop with Robert Blackburn, USA. She has been the curator for China Art Academy print Biennial and for Jawahar Kala Kendra.

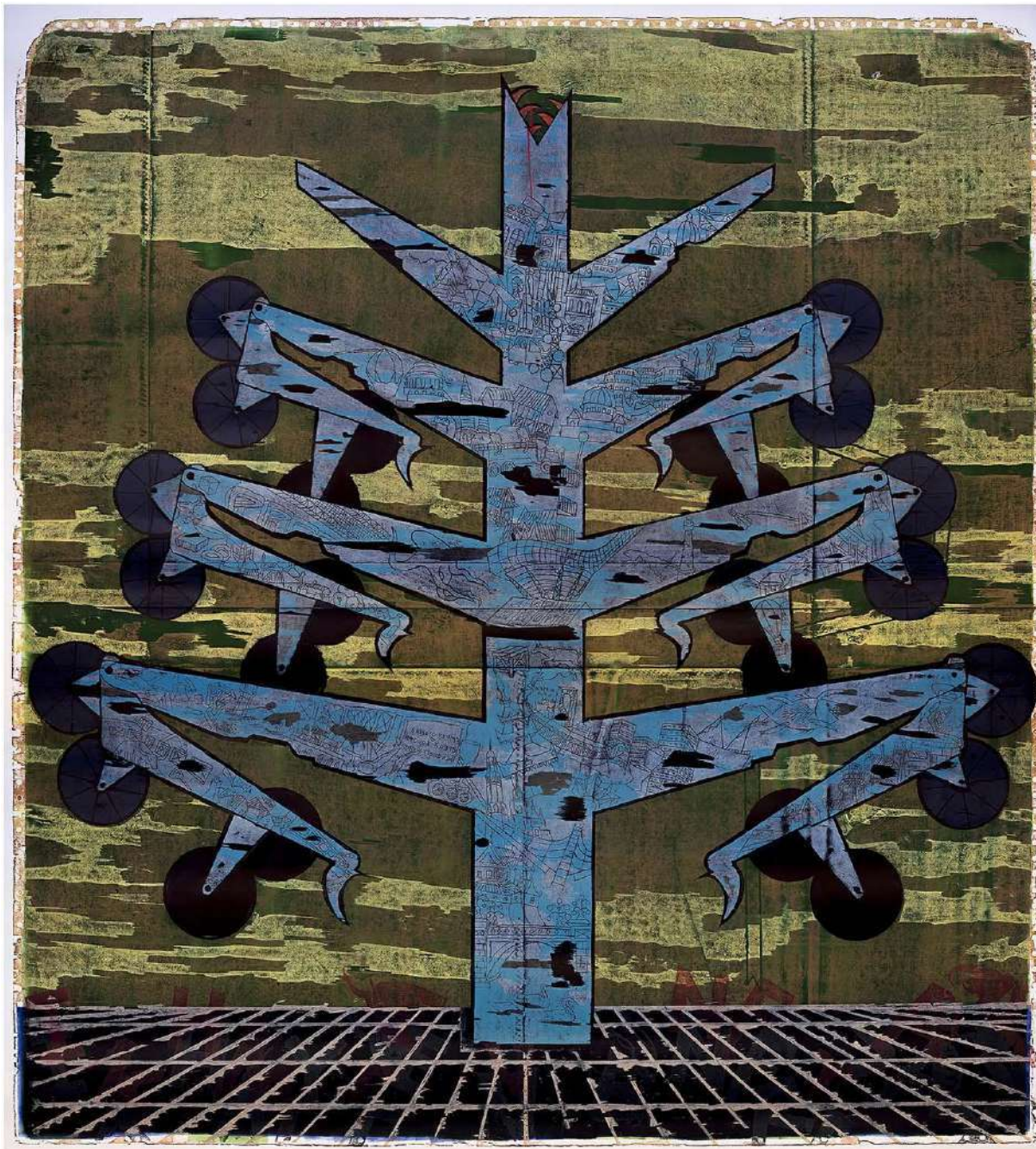

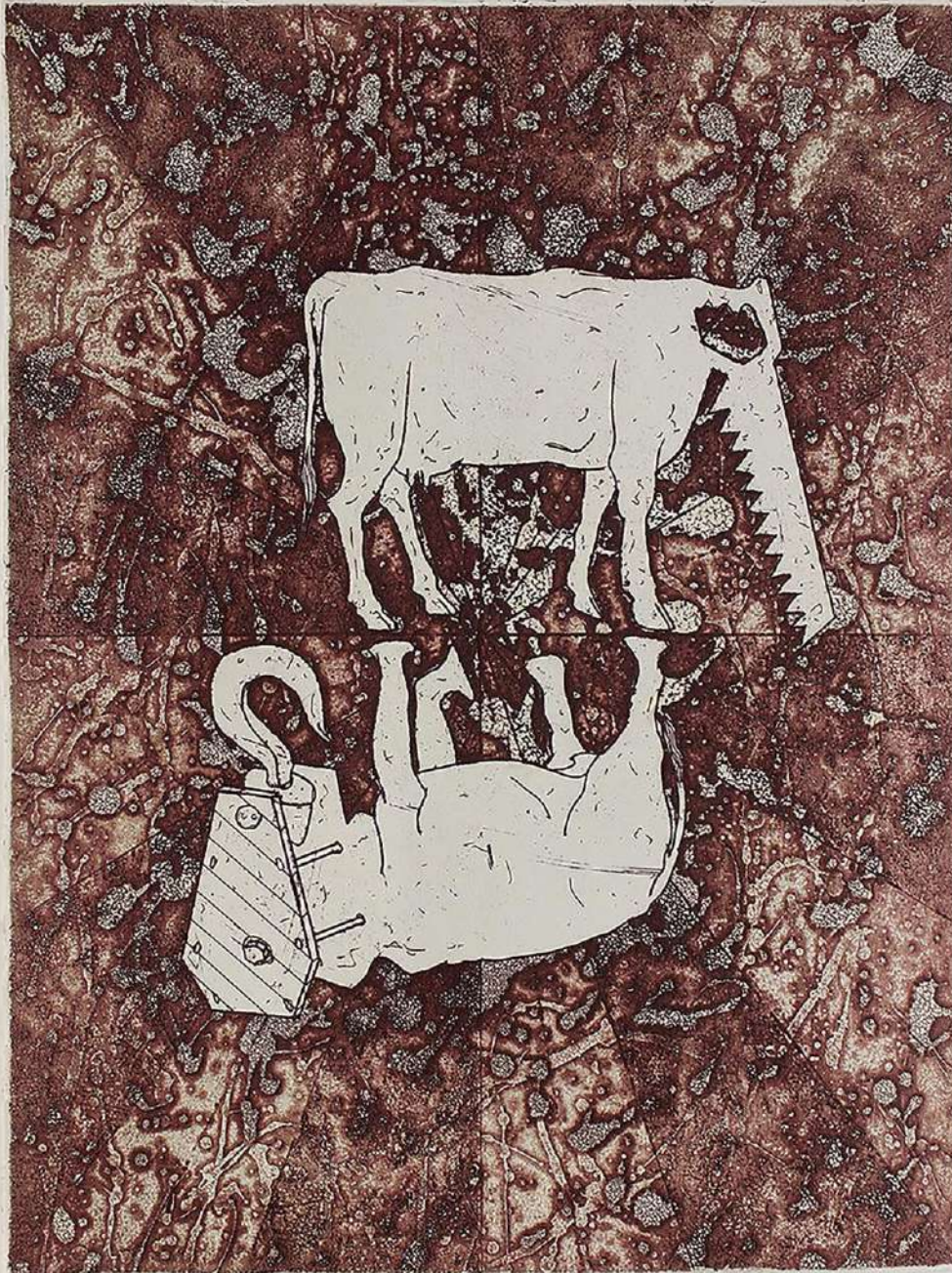
Apart from his own practice he is currently working as artist coordinator at Uttarayan Art Centre in Vadodara.



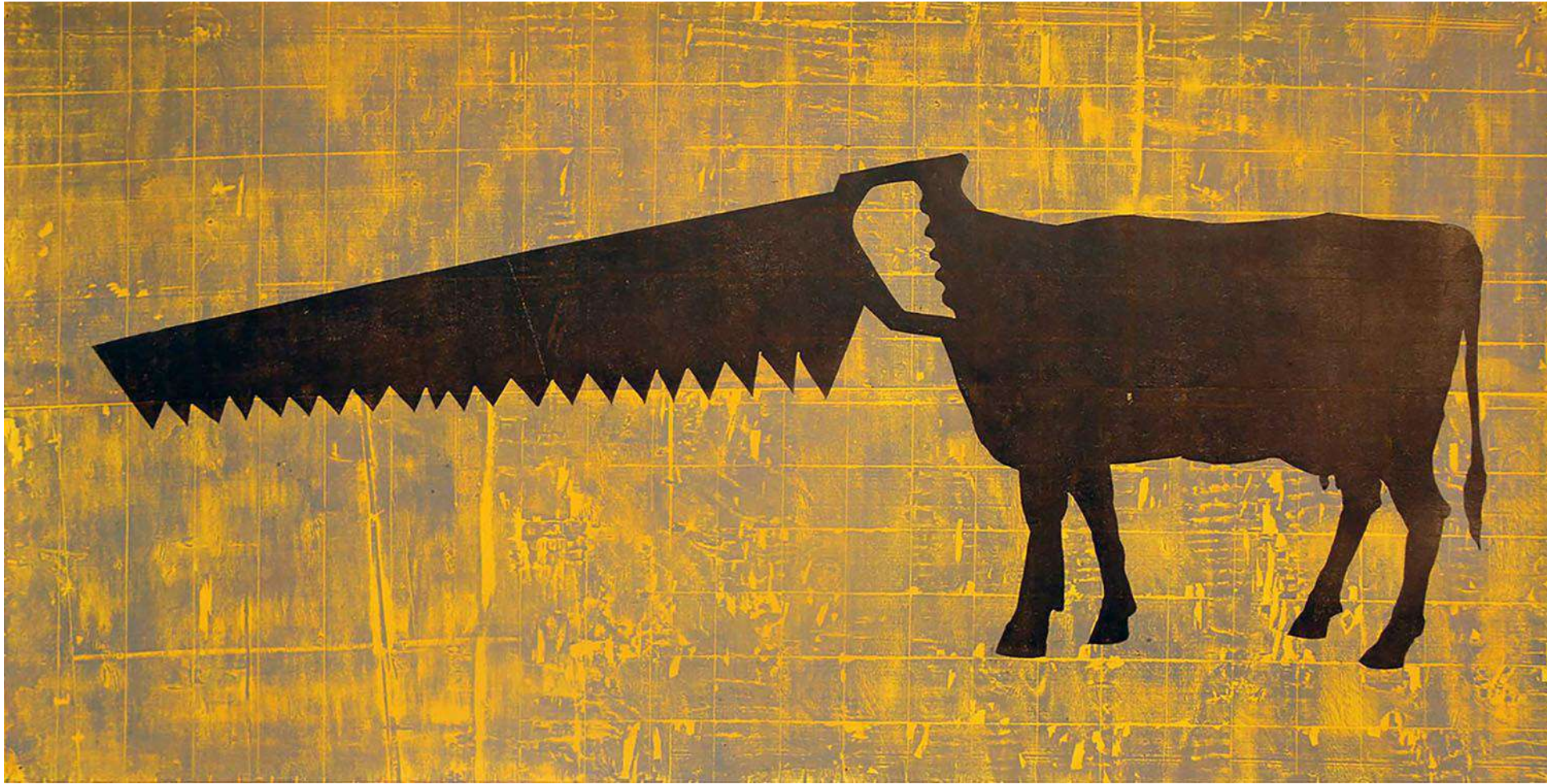
Bhaskar Vadla

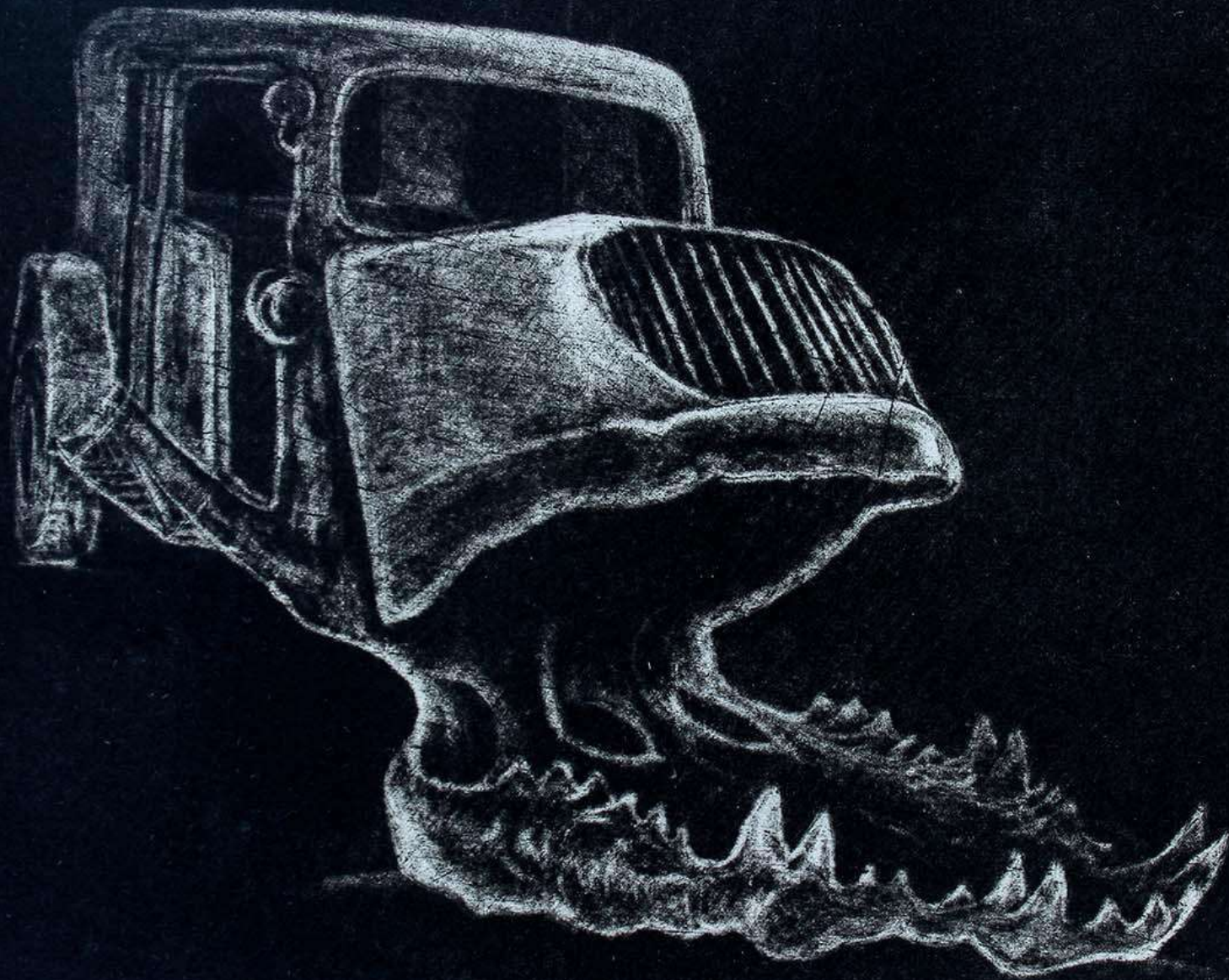
Bhaskar Vadla

Sonal Varshneya

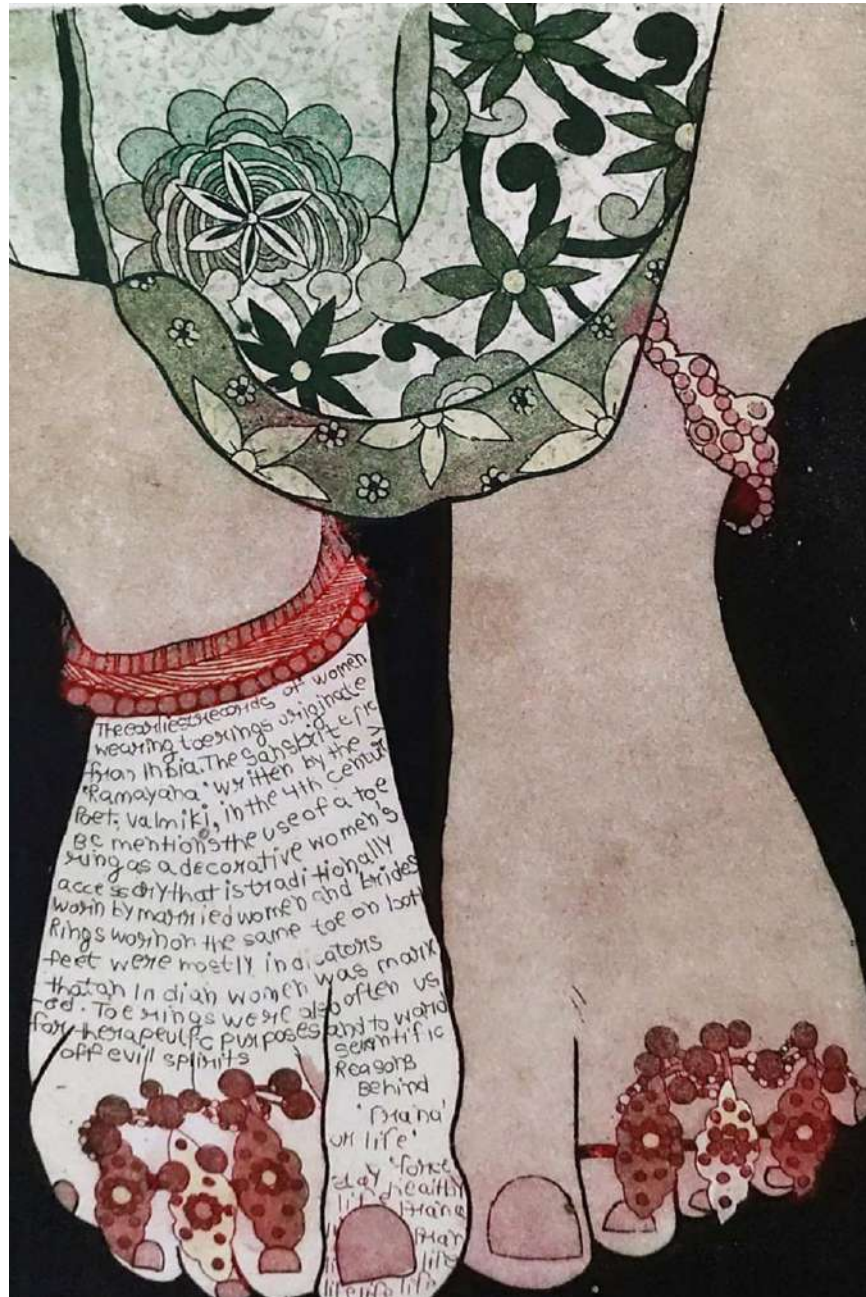
Sonal Varshneya, born 1985, completed her post-graduation in Printmaking from Lalit Kala Sansthan, Agra.

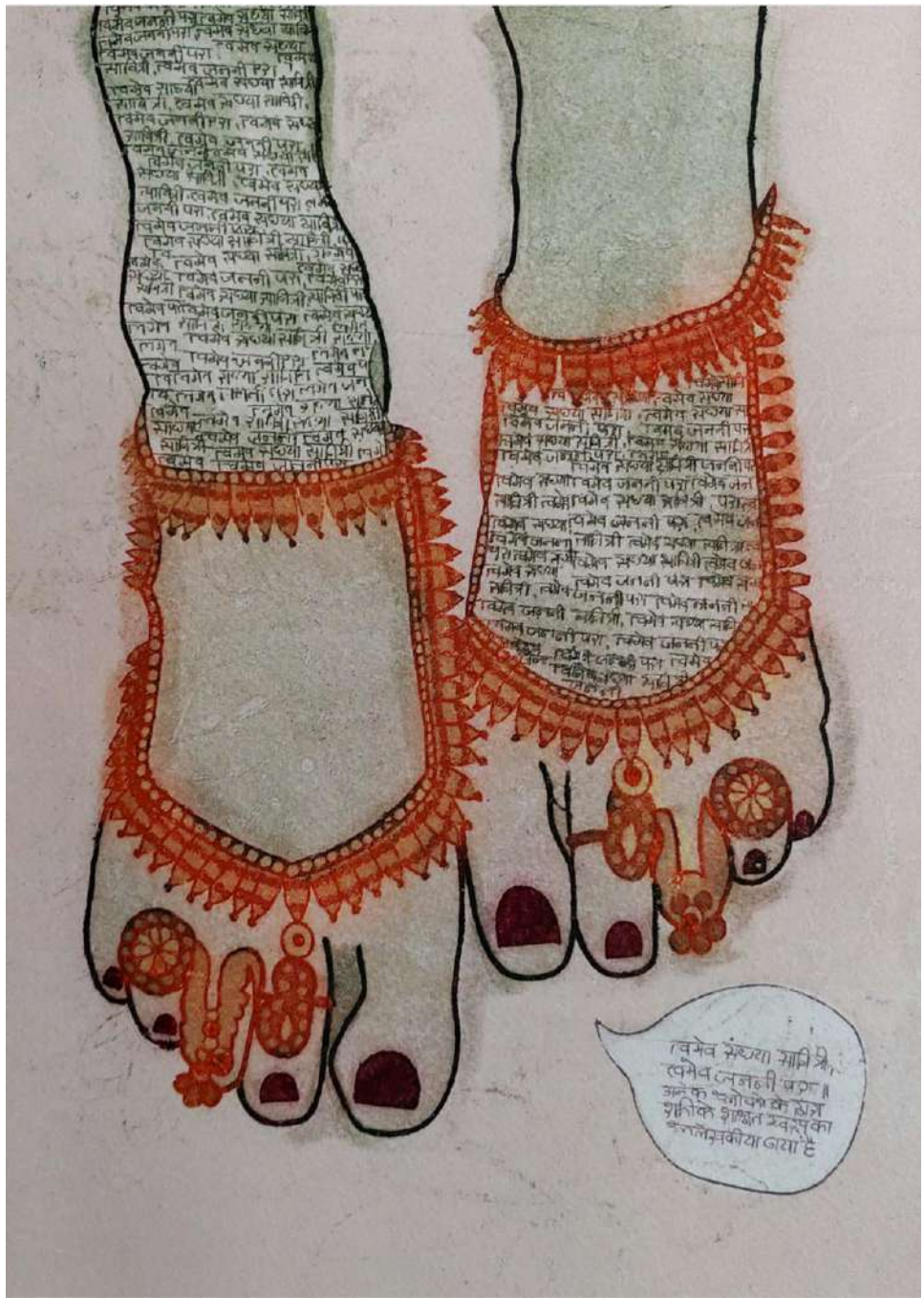
Sonal Varshneya
